


Irvin High School Senior Passport & Incentives

Paper application is available October 1.


Students are encouraged to submit by November 15. Students should keep a copy for themselves and mail a copy to each Texas school they are applying for admission to.

Do I need good grades to apply for Financial Aid?



FALSE!

When you first apply, you don't need good grades.

After first semester in college, grades will factor in for continued eligibility.

TEM HB 3 Changes – Financial Aid Application Requirement

New Graduation Requirement

Beginning in 2021-2022, each student must do one of the following in order to graduate:

- complete and submit a free application for federal student aid (FAFSA)
- complete and submit a Texas application for state financial aid (TASFA)
- submit a signed opt-out form

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Scholarship Essays & Letters of Recommendation

Essays

- Answer prompts on ApplyTexas and/or the Common App
- > Personal narrative to include:
 - > Extenuating circumstances/unique situations
 - Community/School involvement
 - Career/educational goals such as intended major
 - ➤ How will you benefit your community
- ➤ Have English Teacher or librarian proofread, get a second opinion, write for your audience
- Re-use and modify as needed, scholarship specific

Target date: As early as possible but not later than January 1st

Letters of Recommendation

- \triangleright Have 2 3 ready
- Request from counselor, teachers, coaches, club sponsors, community members
- > Request with advanced notification, 2 weeks before
- Provide a brag sheet of achievements
 - School and community involvement
 - School/community awards
 - Classes taken (DC, AP, OnRamps, CTE, etc)
 - Work experience
 - Purpose of letter

Target date: As early as possible but not later than January 1st



SAT and ACT Tests

- > Check with your desired college/university for requirements and deadlines
- ➤ Register online by deadline various test dates/centers available
- ➤ Waiver for eligible students
 - ➤ SAT online on your College Board account
 - >ACT with Ms. Gutierrez or Ms. Rivera
- ➤ SAT School Day Thursday, October 28 ****
 - ➤ No need to register, completely free at Irvin High School for students classified Grade 12



How do you apply for admission to College?

- 1) Check requirements, deadlines, and programs of study
- 2) Complete the online application
 - a. ApplyTexas, or
 - b. Common App
- 3) Send your test scores
 - a. TSI
 - b. SAT or ACT
- 4) Send your HS Transcript and if applicable, college transcripts
- 5) Call or Email Admissions Representative and attend information sessions
- 6) Send Financial Aid Information
- 7) Apply for Scholarships
- 8) Proof of Meningitis Vaccine or waiver
- 9) Check financial aid award package, available around March
- 10) Check registration status, attend New Student Orientation

TSI Requirement Texas Success Initiative Assessment



The TSI Assessment (TSIA) is part of the Texas Success Initiative program designed to help Texas colleges or universities determine if students are ready for college-level course work in the areas of English language arts and mathematics.

Incoming college students in Texas, are required to take the TSI Assessment - unless they are already exempt to determine their readiness for college-level work. Based on how they perform on the assessment, students may either be enrolled in a college-level course and/or be placed in the appropriate developmental course or intervention to improve their skills and prepare them for success in college-level courses.

For detailed information on TSIA and/or exemptions, talk to your Academic Counselor.

Note: Students enrolled in a HS college prep course, that earn semester averages of 75 or above (for both semesters) may be exempt from the TSIA requirement at EPCC and UTEP.
